
“Johnny, Johnny”, “Yes Papa”

Higglety, pigglety pop


Higglety, pigglety pop

Rain, rain go away


Rain, rain go away

Rain, rain go away.






Two little hands

One little head goes side to side.




Let us ring

Barber, barber


Barber, barber, shave a pig!

Teapot


I am a little teapot

And said, "What a good boy am I!"






There was a maid on Scrabble Hill

Wiggle, waggle went his tail.






Once I saw a little bird

And so they all went home again.






Vintery, mintery, cutery, corn


Vintery, mintery, cutery, corn

And drummed them out of town!






A swarm of bees

Get it done by half past eight.


Stitch it up, and stitch it down,

Now you come at noon.






Two little dickey birds
